






2021-2022 Varsity Season Recap

Season Summary

During another season of Covid struggles where the Tigers had a 17 day gap in between games and a full roster was not available until the final weeks, Biddeford advanced to the Expo and quarterfinals once again with a thrilling upset road playoff win vs. #6 Freeport. It marked the 4th trip to the Expo in the last 5 seasons for the Tigers, its best five year stretch since 1979-1984. Biddeford's season would end in the quarterfinals to #3 Seed Marshwood 47-30. Biddeford would finish the year 4-15.

With COVID taking away the 2020-2021 season, Biddeford's roster had little varsity experience. After a 1-6 start, Biddeford was able to win back to back home games using full court pressure to jump start their offense with some easy buckets. Unfortunately, the Tigers were shut down due to COVID and endured a 17 day break in between games. Upon returning, the Tiger loss their last 8 games to finish 3-14 and grabbing the #11 seed in the playoffs.

For many teams, these struggles and setbacks would be too difficult to overcome, but not this group. With tremendous senior leadership, Biddeford would travel to #6 Freeport (9-8) for a road playoff game for a chance to get to the Expo. Biddeford would pull out the win 55-54 in comeback fashion. Trailing by as many as 8 points in the 4th quarter and multiple times, Biddeford refused to give in or give up. The Tigers just kept playing. Biddeford would take the lead for the first time in the 2nd half with 24 seconds left as Julius Silva scored on a lay-up. Biddeford would not allow Freeport to get a shot at the rim to win in dramatic fashion 55-54. The win was a testament to the character of this senior class and team.

Throughout the season, the Tigers handled themselves with class and sportsmanship in wins and losses, and represented the program to the highest level.

Top Individual Highlights

- **1. Sr. Ayouba Fofana**, was selected to the Second Team Class A South and First Team SMAA Class A South all star team. Ayouba would score 32 points at Brunswick scoring the most points in a game for Biddeford player since at least the 2012 season.
- 2. Jr. Julius Silva, was selected to the SMAA Class A South honorable mention team. Julus had a positive assist to turnover ratio and led the team in three point made field goals. Julius would connect on six three pointers in a playoff and score 22 points. While unofficial, his six threes is the most made three pointers in a single playoff game in BHS history.
- **3. Sr. Kyle Dion**, would lead the team in deflections (45) and steals (42). Dion was constantly everywhere on the court utilizing a high motor of activity and heart on the defensive end. He would also lead the team in charges taken.







"What can I do to help the team in practice?"



Sr. Dillon Boutin (2015-2016)

Theme: SERVANT LEADERSHIP

<u>Quote:</u> "I will ask not what the Biddeford basketball program, coaches, and teammates can do for me, but rather what I can do for my Biddeford basketball program, coaches, and teammates".

<u>Story</u>: During a 1-17 season, we were about 1-8. Sr. Dillon Boutin was not in the playing rotation and a first year varsity player. After a practice during the week before leaving for the locker room, Dillon came over and wanted to talk. It was not about playing time or how many shots he was getting. He said to me, "Coach, what can I do to help this team improve during practice time?" I was shocked by the question because I was expecting the normal, "Coach, why am I not getting any minutes?" Or, "Coach, what can I do to get more minutes?" Nothing about him and all about the team and program. He did this when we weren't 8-1, but 1-8!

In a later game at Sanford, Dillon got in for the last 2 minutes of the game in a blowout. Dillon would go on to make 3 consecutive three pointers. He forced me to play him more. He wasn't sour about when he was playing, he took advantage of it. He played in both halves for the rest of the season.

I would nominate Dillon Boutin for the Varsity Maine Awards for Unsung Hero, and he would be selected as a finalist. Dillon would be awarded the Tiger Pride Award as a Senior.

Making an Individual Change For the Team



Sr. Zach Reali (2017-2018)

Theme: ROLE

Quote: "I will accept my role, fulfill my role, and embrace my role"

<u>Story:</u> The 2017-18 season was not a great start for Zach as there was a verbal exchange after our first preseason scrimmage of the year (this story will be discussed later). Zach could be negative in losses or things not going well, and was focused on individual accomplishments. After a needed coach/player meeting, we saw a new player in Zach and more importantly a new teammate in Zach. He accepted his role, he focused on the team achievements first, and he was positive, always being the first to give a high five.

This was Zach's comment in the Press Herald after his tip-in buzzer beater vs. Brunswick in the Quarterfinals. Zach went into the game with only 2 minutes left because of foul trouble and made an impact.

"I noticed my guy didn't crash (the boards), so I went in and got it and put it up," said Reali, a senior who finished with three points. "I'm just a role player, so I figured (when I went in) that I would do my role, like hand the ball off to the guards and set screens."

Zach would go on to win our most prestigious award of the season, the Hard Hat Award for best teammate of the season. And his tip in buzzer beater in the playoffs would win Play of the Year at the Varsity Maine Awards.

How tough can I coach you? How quick is your next play speed?



Jr. Carter Edgerton (2017-2018)

Theme: R FACTOR (Next Play Speed)

Quote: "If I can't coach you, I can't play you." - John Calipari

<u>Story</u>: Late during the 2017-18 season at Noble, Carter is playing defense and his on ball defense on his player was not what it needs to be. On a play in the second half, the Noble player drives by Carter and draws the foul. As teams set-up for a foul shot, the coaches decide a change needs to be made in match-ups. I yell out to Kyle Norton, "Kyle, you take #22." Carter immediately turns to Kyle and asks, "Kyle, what number were you guarding?"

First, this is a perfect example of Next Play Speed. No time to pout, feel sorry for yourself, or make excuses. It is time to think about the next offensive and defensive possession as quickly as we can.

Second, this is being extremely coachable. I did not have to worry about Carter's "feelings". I was able to coach him quickly and efficiently. I did not have to explain to him why. And if he did not know, he knew that was not the time to discuss, after the game or before next practice would be the appropriate time.

Carter Edgerton would go on to win the Hard Hat Award (best teammate) for three out of four seasons, and start for all four years.

Team/Program First Above Everything Else



Sr. Nate Boutin (2017-2018)

Theme: SERVANT LEADERSHIP; ROLE

Quote: "In the end, your team doesn't care if you are a superstar. They care if you are a super teammate."

Story: During a thrilling 5 OT win vs. Marshwood, this player's parent was sitting behind the home bench. This player was not going in for the start of the 4th quarter with some younger guys getting some more playing minutes. His parent was sitting behind our bench and said at one point during the game to the player, "You going to keep sitting on the bench?" Nate responded to the parent during the 4th quarter break, "If you don't like it, then you can leave!"

The ultimate team first comment. The player put his team, coaching staff, and his role all above his personal goals and even his family wants. When I told this story by our coaching staff after the game, there was a tremendous amount of respect and gratitude to this player for sticking up for his teammates and coaches.

Now, his minutes did not increase because of this or gained respect of the player as a person, because ultimately your given talent is a major factor.

Winning the game is more important than my individual stats



Jr. Cody Saucier (2017-2018)

Theme: MOTIVATION

Quote: "In the end, your team doesn't care if you are a superstar. They care if you are a super teammate."

<u>Story:</u> On a road game at Falmouth with the Tigers looking for their 9th win on the season, Cody Saucier was leading the team in scoring with over 13 points a game. Cody Saucier did not take one shot in the first half, our leading scorer. To be honest, it is actually bad coaching. But by the way Cody played on offense and defense, you would never know!!! His energy and commitment never changed. You could not tell whether he had zero points or twenty points, it was all about what can I do to help this team win the game?

Cody would later score his only basket on a big three pointer to put the Tigers up 6 with 2 minutes left.

Cody would go to be the team MVP, selected to 3rd team all-SMAA, and lead the team in points.

Players taken leadership and ownership of team



Sr. Jackson Oloya (2017-2018)

Theme: ACCOUNTABILITY & FUNDAMENTAL

<u>Quote:</u> "On good teams, coaches hold players accountable, on great teams players hold players accountable." – Joe Dumars

<u>Story:</u> After the first preseason scrimmage, a teammate went negative in the locker room before the coaches entered the room for post game talk. Jackson said no, that would not be ok this season. Jackson stood up for the team and did not want to have this type of energy on this team. This moment was a turning point for this team. In the end, he made a teammate become a better teammate and set the tone for the season that the players were going to hold each other accountable to the wants of the coaching staff.

This moment was the starting point of Zach Reali winning the Hard Hat Award at the end of the season.

Jackson Oloya would later go on to win the SMAA Defensive Player of the Year Award, which is the only time in SMAA history that a Biddeford player won the award.

FUNDAMENTAL: Jackson Oloya did not play meaningful varsity minutes until their Senior year. Yet it never changed their attitude or commitment to getting better. Story: Jerome Criado (as well as Jackson Oloya) did not play meaningful varsity minutes until their Senior year. Yet it never changed his attitude or commitment to getting better. He swung down to JV, he played in summer JV games as a Junior to continue to improve his game. He was entitled to nothing. He just kept working at their game until it was his moment. And when his moment came, he was ready because he prepared for it since Freshman year by being a great practice and drill player. He never complained one time.

In his senior year, Jerome was magnificent. Jerome would hit essentially 2 game winners (including one vs. rival TA) and be a Finalist for the Varsity Maine Awards "Beyond the Box Score". Jerome would be awarded the 2017-18 Team Unsung Hero Award for his play coming off the bench and clutch shots all season in the big moments. Jackson Oloya would win the SMAA Defensive Player of the Year Award which is the only time in SMAA history that a Biddeford player won the award.

Kurtis, who swung down to JV, would watch the Freshmen officials to see how they would call the block/charge call. Once he knew his answer, then he would adjust for his upcoming JV game. His mind was focused on the task at hand way before the game even started.

Kurtis would go on to lead the entire program in offensive charges taken for the 2017-18 season.

<u>SELF-AWARENESS</u>: Providence team camp 2019, our team had just lost to Brunswick in the semifinals of the Varsity small division. Kurtis played a lot of point guard that game, and struggled getting us set up in our offense and had some turnovers. Usually when this happens, players will look for excuses of why they had a tough game. It is a way to make themselves feel better and take the blame off of their shoulders. Story: (From Press Herald)

In Austin Dutremble's first three seasons, Biddeford went 0-18, 1-17 and 1-17. That's 2-52. As a 5-foot-8 freshman, Dutremble was the best option at power forward, a position he continued to play. "Anyone can be a good teammate when you win," said Justin Tardif, Biddeford's basketball coach, who nominated Dutremble for the award. "He was always a good teammate. He was like the rock in our program and he kept other kids positive." In basketball, the Tigers were much improved, going 8-11 and losing a quarterfinal game to Falmouth. Known as a defender and hustle guy, Dutremble scored 26 points in a key win against Cape Elizabeth. "It was so tough those first three years," Dutremble said. "It was a great feeling to finally get noted for all of our hard work." Dutremble, ranked 10th in his graduating class, will stay in his hometown and study medical biology at the University of New England.

Austin would win Role Model of the Year at the Varsity Maine Awards and also be inducted into the WCSH 6 Varsity Club. These awards were because of how he handled himself during the more difficult moments in our program's history. His demeanor and positivity kept teammates and the coaching staff moving forward.

His effort did not depend on how many points he scored or how many shots he took, his effort was his effort. It never changed.

One play in particular sticks out to Kyle's relentless effort. In a second quarter game vs. Brunswick, Kyle scored on a lob putting us up a few points. On the lay-up, Kyle fell to the floor. At this point we were pressing, so Kyle had to get up quickly to set up in the press. And that he did. It took Kyle a mere 4 seconds to go from the floor on the baseline to his half court spot with his body turned and locked in. He sprinted to his location. This was not the 4th quarter with 1 minute left, where many players would play hard, this was in the second quarter during the middle of season, and Kyle gave everything he had to get to the right spot in the press.

Kyle would lead our team in deflections, steals, and transition points. In our playoff win at Freeport, Kyle scored 12 points with 4 points coming off of steals. Kyle would be awarded our "Sweat More" award given to the player who worked the hardest.
